A new and productive line of income for the club has come about by the ideas, contacts and hard work from the team at ‘Rob & Ben’s Bar @ Coalcliff SLSC’, hosting great bands on the clubs deck on Sunday afternoons, drawing huge crowds with everyone having a great time. The 2011/ 2012 Triple Crown
